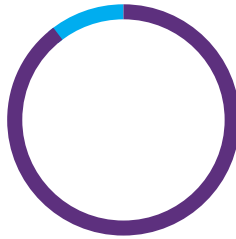

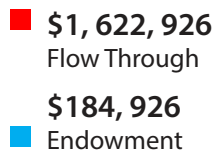


## By the Numbers

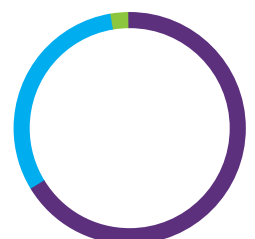
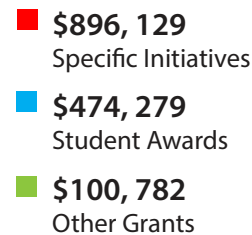

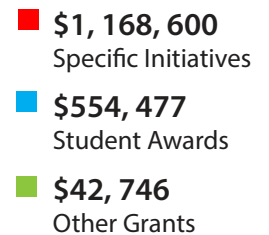
Gifts by Type

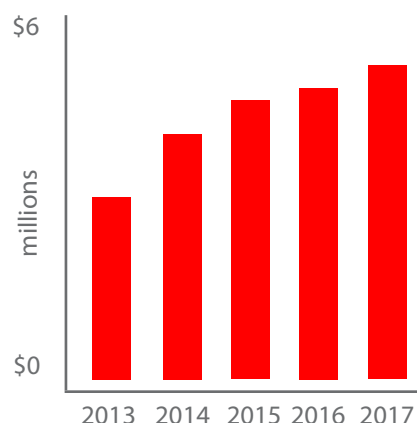
