



KEN KING COURTS



Ken King Courts, located in Sandy Beach Park, stand as a vibrant tribute to a man whose passion for sport and community helped shape Calgary's landscape.

Ken King was many things to many people: a visionary businessman, a passionate sports enthusiast, a generous mentor, and a trusted friend. But perhaps most importantly, he was someone who was devoted to the city and the well-being of Calgarians. He dedicated his life to creating spaces and opportunities for sports and movement. He left his mark in places across Calgary, where we connect and build communities through recreation.

Ken King Courts feature two pickleball courts designed for players of all ages and skill levels. Pickleball, one of North America's fastest-growing sports, is popular for its inclusivity and social benefits, blending elements of tennis, badminton, and ping-pong into a game that anyone can learn and enjoy.

The courts have quickly become a gathering place for recreation, competition, and

community spirit, echoing Ken King's belief in the power of sport to uplift and unite.

The creation of Ken King Courts is part of a broader vision for Sandy Beach Park, which is undergoing enhancements including a new picnic area, improved parking, and upgraded pathways. These improvements will ensure that the park remains accessible and welcoming, furthering Parks Foundation's mission to enrich Calgary's outdoor spaces for everyone.

Ken King Courts are the result of significant community partnership and philanthropic effort. It is a symbol of what can be achieved when vision, generosity, and community come together. It is a living testament to a man who understood that sport has the power to transform lives.

A STORY OF RENEWAL

CALGARY FLAMES RINK AWARD - CRESCENT HEIGHTS

For over three decades, the wooden hockey rink in Crescent Heights stood as a landmark of cherished memories for residents. Families and friends gathered in this beloved space, creating experiences across generations whatever the season may be.

“Everybody loves the outdoor skating rink, and it gets people out,” Crescent Heights Community Association Parks Director, Humaira Palibroda shared during an interview.

Over the years, a team of dedicated volunteers maintained the structure for the community to enjoy year-round. It was where neighbours met, kids played, and community spirit thrived. It was more than a play space for winter. It was a place where families gathered and connected every season.

When 2024 arrived, the skating rink, along with the wooden boards that stood around it for more than 30 years, reached the end of its life

cycle. A vandalism incident that damaged 20% of the enclosure delivered the final verdict: the beloved amenity needed renewal.

The community association saw an opportunity to strike a committee with a vision of a revitalized amenity that everyone can access. This vision led them to a partnership with Parks Foundation and access to the Flames Rink Award, an initiative funded by the Calgary Flames to nurture and enhance new and updated rink projects throughout Calgary.

As the project unfolded, Parks Foundation continued supporting the development through the Project Support Program. Through the wonderful support of Calgary Flames Foundation, as well as other donors and supporters, the new rink now remains a cornerstone of community life, enriching lives and providing an avenue for people of all ages to access sport outdoors.

A STORY OF COLLECTIVE VISION

GEORGE MOSS PARK ENHANCEMENT PHASE 1



The revitalization of George Moss Park in Ogden was born from a simple observation: local children playing basketball on a bare concrete slab, wishing for more. Inspired by this need, Youth Centres of Calgary and Parks Foundation rallied support from community members and organizations. After collaborative efforts towards planning and fundraising, we raised more than \$800,000 through the generosity of our donors.

Since then, George Moss Park has undergone a remarkable transformation. It has emerged as a vibrant gathering place that reflects the voices of local residents, whose feedback shaped every aspect of the redevelopment.

The park now boasts multiple amenities, including three multi-sport courts with a full-size basketball court, an artistic court mural, tot lot playground, a community plaza with picnic areas and seating, and an outdoor skating surface for winter activities.

This redevelopment marks the first phase of transformation for a park that has long served as a green canvas for Ogden families. Thanks to a generous donation from the Martin family, construction will soon begin on Phase 2, Calgary's first ever combined Pump Track and Skatepark. This innovative addition will offer a welcoming environment for skateboarders, scooter riders, and cyclists of all ages.

The successful redevelopment of George Moss Park was made possible by a powerful partnership among the Government of Alberta, City of Calgary, Green Line project, Calgary Flames Foundation, The Sofina Foundation, Calgary Foundation, Thornhill Child Care Society, Youth Centres of Calgary, and, most importantly, the residents of Ogden. Their collective vision and determination have transformed a once underutilized space into a thriving, inclusive park that will serve generations to come.

A STORY OF COMING TOGETHER

BUILDING COMMUNITIES - ST. ALPHONSUS SCHOOL



In 1998, a simple playground took root at St. Alphonsus School in Renfrew. It was a modest collection of equipment where kindergarteners through grade nine students could play. For over two decades, it served its purpose. But as the years passed, something beautiful and challenging began to unfold: the community grew, and so did its dreams of what play could become.

Through years of unwavering dedication of St. Alphonsus School Playground Society, volunteers worked tirelessly to collect the resources needed to create something extraordinary.

In September 2024, their vision became reality. St. Alphonsus School Accessible Playground emerged as a vibrant testament to what happens when a community works together to ensure no child is left behind.

Families embraced the much-anticipated playground with its wide range of climbers, slides, monkey bars, ramps, and more. It was designed with accessibility features and interactive elements that children with varying abilities can enjoy. Every element had been thoughtfully crafted with a principle that every child deserves to play.

Today, More than 450 schoolchildren and neighborhood kids have grown to love this cherished playground. Among them are children with cognitive, physical, and behavioral differences, including students who navigate the world on wheels. Each child came with the same fundamental need to play, to belong, to feel the joy that comes from childhood's simplest moments.

This playground is a living classroom where creativity flourishes. It allows children to both play and grow in their physical literacy, communication, leadership skills, and many more. The playground has cultivated creativity and joy among kids and adults alike.

Five years ago, on Christmas Eve, Doreen passed away peacefully in her home. Today, Doreen's picnic table is more than just a place to sit. It is a living tribute to a remarkable woman whose spirit continues to inspire all who visit. A STORY OF BELONGING

FOREST LAWN PARK



Forest Lawn Park has long been a cherished green space for residents. What was once an open field is now a major recreation area used by sports enthusiasts and families from across the city, thanks to the collective vision and determination of Parks Foundation, Forest Lawn Community Association, and The City of Calgary.

Forest Lawn is a strong, vibrant, and incredibly diverse community that has grown rapidly over the past few decades. The revitalization project of Forest Lawn Park reflects the need to provide children and youth a welcoming space to play, enjoy the outdoors, and cherish the community they live in.

Through the support of our funders, donors, and partners, we secured \$1.6 million with \$970,000 allocated for the gathering space and basketball courts, and \$700,000 for the inclusive playground.

Today, Forest Lawn Park is a vibrant place that

offers amenities everyone can enjoy, from a sport court, to a seating and community gathering area, as well as accessible pathways.

These features provide opportunities for play, rejuvenation, and physical activity, fostering a sense of belonging for all who visit. It has become a landmark for a dynamic hub in Calgary.

A particularly exciting addition is the new inclusive playground, funded by The City of Calgary's Parks and Playground Amenities Program (PAPA). This playground goes beyond basic accessibility standards, offering an environment where children and citizens of all abilities can interact and participate together. Designed with input from the community, it supports the needs of individuals with mobility limitations, visual impairments, or neurodiverse conditions such as autism, ensuring equitable participation and joyful experiences for everyone.

A STORY OF INNOVATION

The Martin Family Legacy Garden - Canada's First Dementia Inclusive Park

The Martin Family Legacy Garden represents a pioneering approach to public space design, specifically created to serve the growing population affected by dementia-related conditions. This innovative project addresses a critical gap and demonstrates our commitment to equity and inclusion for all residents.

With increasing rates of dementia diagnoses nationwide, this park will serve as a model for communities across the country seeking to create supportive environments for those living with cognitive challenges. This project is a result of strong community partnerships and the generosity of several donors, including The City of Calgary and Government of Alberta. It emerged from a collaborative design process that brought together leading researchers, healthcare professionals, community advocates, individuals and families impacted by dementia.

Through the incredible generosity of the Martin family, our keystone donor, and the Richardson family, our major donor, we have raised a total

investment of over \$4 million.

The park is now scheduled for construction this summer with an aim to welcome its first visitors in the fall of 2026, marking a new chapter in inclusive public spaces for all Canadians.

It will not just become a physical location, but a healing sanctuary where individuals living with dementia, their caregivers, and families can escape societal barriers and immerse themselves in the therapeutic benefits of nature. This landmark development demonstrates Parks Foundation's leadership to inclusive community planning and person-centered design.

The sustainability of this transformative space requires ongoing stewardship. To ensure the Martin Family Legacy Garden continues to serve generations to come, Parks Foundation welcomes continued donations to support this visionary initiative.


