It is a relief and an honour to watch Shelter Movers continue to thrive despite facing another year of being impacted by COVID-19. As we enter a recovery phase of the pandemic, we cannot forget the risks it presented, nor the changes it brought to the fabric of our organization. While schools and businesses remained closed, our employees and volunteers continued to show up everyday to serve survivors – knowing full well our service cannot shut down.

In February 2022, the Board approved a 3 year strategic plan (2022-2025) centred on increasing access to Shelter Movers services nationwide, and becoming a nationally recognized organization of excellence. To accomplish these goals, we will increase our focus on traditionally underserved populations including 2SLGBTQIA+, Indigenous, and differently abled individuals. We will also establish a long-term resiliency plan to secure additional sources of multi-year funding.

Over the past year, Shelter Movers received a notable number of local and national awards for its impact in the community, particularly from United Way Halifax, Zonta Club of Toronto, and the office of the Governor General of Canada.

Moving forward, Shelter Movers has begun the process of establishing our newest chapter in Moncton, New Brunswick coming in 2022. This would not be possible without the collaboration of the YWCA and the enthusiastic response from local citizens, electoral officials, and community agencies.


Most importantly, I am touched to hear of the gratitude felt by our volunteers and staff when accompanying a survivor in her journey to freedom.

1 OPERATIONAL FOUNDATION


Building a strong foundation is important for two primary reasons. It establishes a culture of trust, confidence and motivation in all members of the organization to achieve a focused goal. Secondly, it provides the stability and resilience required to continuously improve and ultimately scale Shelter Movers' core services.

2 GROWTH FRAMEWORK

Growth can include extensions of existing chapters, expansions (i.e. creating new chapters), new teams or functions. The growth decision making process must be robust, transparent, and consistent. A framework is required for evaluating the expansion process to ensure new chapters are set up for success.

3 LONG-TERM RESILIENCE PLANNING

Charities are susceptible to fluctuating donations and external factors. By establishing long term resilience measures such as funding models, partnerships, and social enterprise activities, Shelter Movers can address vulnerabilities, increase certainty, and ensure impact.

A JOURNEY OF HOPE AND MOVING FORWARD A SURVIVOR STORY

“Aluoch” was working at a bank in Nairobi when she decided to leave everything she knew behind for a chance at safety. With only two suitcases in hand and a phone in her back pocket, Aluoch and her son made the courageous 18 hour flight from Kenya to Canada to escape her abusive partner.

In July 2019, Aluoch arrived in Canada riddled with fear and excitement. But it didn't take long for her to ask herself the dreaded question, “did I make the right decision?” Although shelters all over Canada were narrowing their capacity by the minute, a family shelter for immigrants to Canada found space for Aluoch and her child.

“It's not your home at the end of the day,” she says. “It's only really a roof over your head. It's a big sacrifice.” But, along with that big sacrifice, came a network of women experiencing the same thing. “I felt like I was walking in these other women's shoes. I was so glad to have met them (in the shelter) when they had crossed to the other side of their trauma.”

Beyond therapy and completing a program at the City Adult Learning Center, Aluoch joined Shelter Movers as a volunteer Move Coordinator to help her settle into the city, and heal from her abuse. Not only did volunteering provide her work experience in Canada, but she discovered that the role was a quick way to learn to navigate the city.

“Now when I'm traveling (around the city), it feels familiar. I know the city based on the moves I did and coordinated.”

Aluoch's decision to start over wasn't easy and required a lot of resources to make it happen. If Shelter Movers was available in Kenya the barriers to leave would have been eliminated and she would have been able to start her new life sooner. Through her volunteering at Shelter Movers, Aluoch shares a message of hope to other women who may be experiencing similar situations of violence in their own homes.

“Don't shy away from telling people what you're going through. If you keep quiet, you won't find a solution,” she says.

THE RIPPLE EFFECT OF THE HOUSING CRISIS

Cities all over Canada are in the throes of an unprecedented housing crisis. Between 2021 and 2022, the average home price increased by 20% due to historically low interest rates and short supply. At the same time, the average monthly rent was also on a steady upswing as more and more potential homebuyers were priced out of the market. This lack of housing affordability and availability has resulted in additional barriers for women experiencing violence to leave their abuser.

The increase in gender-based violence during the COVID-19 pandemic has been well documented. Shelters reported an increase in the number of crisis calls and requests for support or services for survivors. Shelter capacity was also greatly impacted. According to Statistics Canada, on the snapshot day of April 14, 2021, 70% of women were turned away because the shelter was considered full.


For women who reside in the shelters, their stays are now lasting longer and longer. Nearly 1 in 5 (19%) short-term shelters reported an average length of stay that exceeded the mandated three months. For Shelter Movers, this means extended storage periods.

“What used to be weeks-long stays at emergency shelters are often months long, because there is simply nowhere for residents to go. In some cases, we will hold survivors’ stuff for well over a year before they can find a place, and are able to leave a shelter,” says Marc Hull-Jacquin.

The rising cost of living and continued financial instability has left many women more reliant on their partners in general. Now, with the added stressors of the housing market, women are forced to make the decision between two evils: returning to their abuser or the risk of homelessness.

Shelter Movers helps fill a critical gap adjacent to the housing crisis. When survivors use our services they do not incur the cost of moving, or storage, allowing them to allocate those dollars to more essential living expenses. Our network of reliable storage facilities allow us to keep our clients’ cherished belongings for longer, in hopes of giving them the autonomy to choose safety.

In addition to providing the only service of its kind in Canada, Shelter Movers offers an extended network of support for survivors of gender-based violence. In collaboration with our staff, volunteers, community / corporate partners, and individual donors, we are confident that we can move forward together, and rise to the exceptional challenges presented by the Canadian housing crisis.

VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT

After completing 47 moves in just under a year, Cherlyne, a Lead Mover with Shelter Movers, shares a memory from her volunteer experience:

"I worked with a client that was living in a shelter with her young daughter. When she initially left her abusive household, she hadn't been able to bring any of her belongings with her, and was afraid of going back alone. The shelter staff contacted us [Shelter Movers], and we accompanied her back to the home that she had shared with her abuser.

I remember being in the car with the client on the way to her previous residence. While I explained the move process, and how we would pack her belongings, I remember her nodding, and trying to stay strong in anticipation of getting this move done ... but her eyes were filled with tears and her hands were shaking.

When our team arrived, we took care of everything. We packed up her clothes, her photos, her documents, and her daughter's toys. As we drove away, it was like she had become a new person. In the car, she was laughing and sharing stories, showing us pictures of her daughter, and telling us about her family. When we brought her back to the shelter, her little girl was waiting. We had all of her toys and stuffed animals ready for her, and you could just see the relief on the client's face. All the stress, anxiety, and fear in her eyes during the initial drive were gone. She could close that chapter of her life. As we said our goodbyes, I knew I had just witnessed the most wonderful, heartwarming experience of a mother being given back her autonomy to restart her life with her daughter by her side."
