John's Story

Like most of us, my dad wanted to die at home. But when his symptoms progressed, and we could not care for him anymore, Dad chose hospice.

The first time I entered Rosedale Hospice with my younger brother, he turned to me and said, "I don't know how to do this." "That's ok," I said, "they do."

They literally and figuratively held our hands, navigating us through the steps.

I saw their many hours caring for Dad, bringing food and medicine, changing him, and bathing him. (They also brought him a lot of bacon sandwiches and got my son, Charlie, a summer's worth of popsicles during visits.) But more important were the hours they spent listening to Dad.

My brief time at Rosedale taught me a few things about hospice. Hospice is merciful. It's considerate, kind and forgiving. Hospice is not only for the dying. It's also for the living. It's for those who leave us and for those of us who must watch them go. My dad felt fortunate to experience the compassion of a dignified death. I feel fortunate for witnessing it.


We must fundraise to provide the right care and support for people's final days.
